

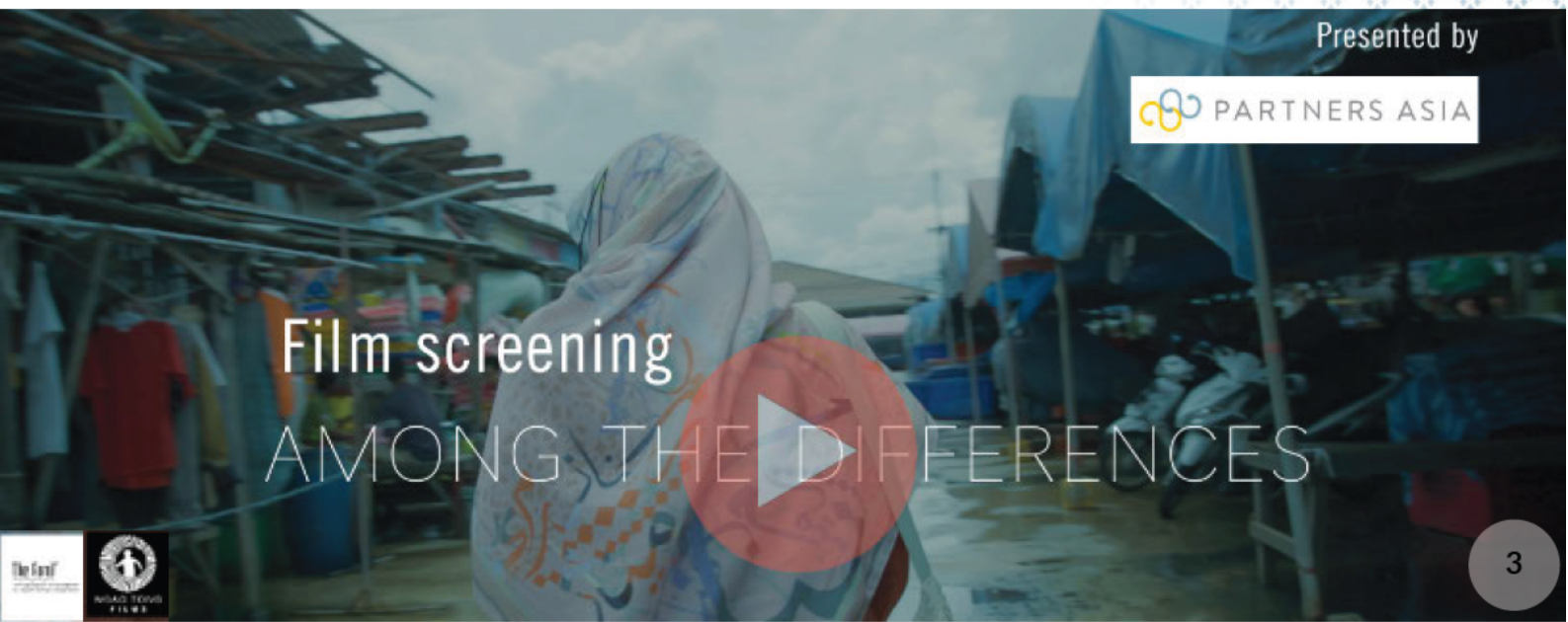

# STORIES OF HOPE

2023 marks another year Partners Asia has witnessed the **compassion, resilience, and determination** of our bold partners on the ground. Here are a few such special moments.

## PA PARTNER GATHERING

Our Partner Gathering was an extraordinary occasion, filled with inspiration and shared insights. Major discussions—interpreted into multiple languages—covered donor relationships, alliance building, and local representation in decision-making. Overwhelmingly positive anonymous feedback included praise for the “inclusive agenda” and “equal participation.” “Seeing people with similar beliefs inspired us and gave us energy to continue the struggle for what we fight for,” one participant said. This was our objective!

## INDIGENOUS YOUTH RAISE THEIR VOICES

Young people from indigenous communities in Southeast Asia face unique social and cultural challenges as they navigate life transitions and uncertain futures. Increasingly, they are leading advocacy movements and embracing their power to demand change. By providing funding for their work and opportunities for training and connection, PA is proud to support emerging leaders’ commitment to achieving recognition of their rights.

# STORIES OF RESILIENCE

During a crisis, we want to make sure our partners do not feel alone. **Flexible funding** allows them to advocate for their communities' rights, determine their priorities together, and keep those who are **most vulnerable** safe. If they are supported to lead in tenuous times, they can build a more secure future.

## CYCLONE MOCHA RESPONSE

In May 2023, Cyclone Mocha devastated parts of coastal Rakhine State, Myanmar and neighboring Bangladesh, killing hundreds of people and displacing more than 100,000, many of whom were ethnic Rohingya already living in refugee and IDP camps. International aid agencies were denied direct access to many affected areas.

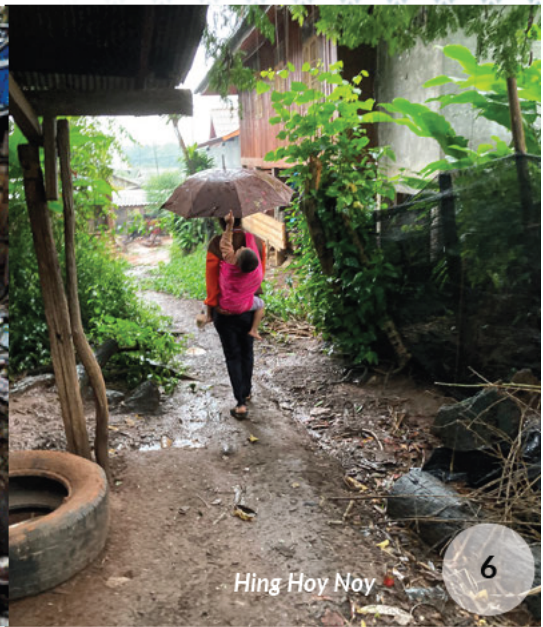
Engaging with our supporters and strategizing with local networks, in just five days Partners Asia raised more than \$40,000 in humanitarian assistance for our partners already on the ground and ready to respond.

# WHAT WE'VE LEARNED

For over 20 years, PA has challenged conventional development practices by **shifting power to local hands** and **building lasting community strength** from the ground up. We are proud of our **multi-ethnic team** whose members speak a total of seven languages and **practice language justice** through inclusive partnerships that do not require English as a common language. To address power imbalances and promote equity, we are committed to:

**Solidarity:** Local experts are the real experts. Our job is to listen, stand with them, and leverage our resources to support their priorities and strategies.

**Trust-Based Relationships:** Sustaining lasting, meaningful, and open connections with our partners is at the core of everything we do.

**Minimizing Red Tape:** One of our partners' biggest complaints is how long it takes for donor resources to reach them, and how funding is often structured in a way that makes it impossible to meet actual needs. That's why we have developed responsive and streamlined grant-making processes based on needs and context.

# OUR SCOPE IN 2023

You supported **\$3.6 million in flexible grants** for **91 organizations and individuals** in 2023.

These grants supported initiatives led by local community groups serving grassroots organizations and their leaders primarily in Southeast Asia.

Your partnership has helped empower locally-led change by:

Shifting decision-making power to communities.

Funding grants for education, community organizing and development, advocacy and human rights defense, feminist leadership and LGBTQI+ rights, and alliance building.

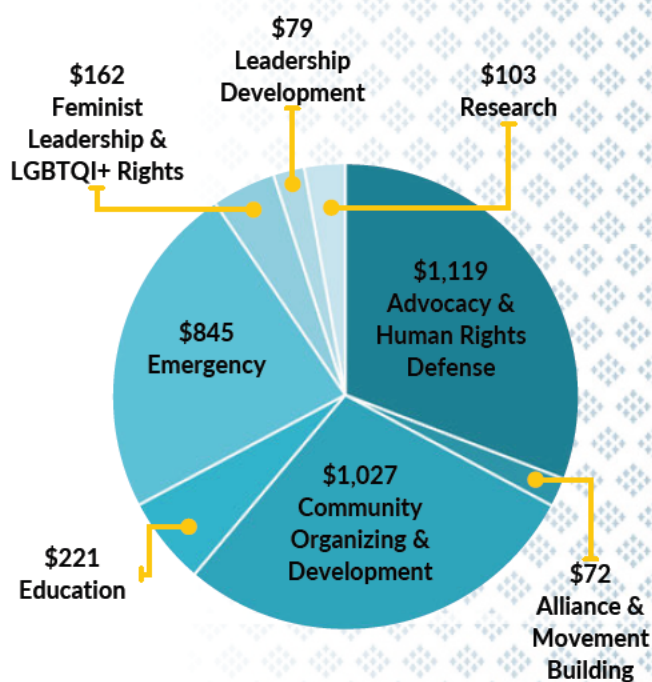


## \$3.6 Million in Flexible Grants

In 2023, Partners Asia gave \$3.6 million in flexible grants. We had **\$2.1 million in direct grants**, and **\$1.5 million in fiscal sponsorships**. We worked with **91 organizations and individuals** to support locally-led initiatives.
