



Our Advisors

We are also fortunate to receive guidance from our **Advisory Council**, made up of five experts from Burma/Myanmar and Thailand. They hold leadership positions in their organizations and are highly respected in their communities, working on issues such as human rights, education, and humanitarian aid. In addition to leading impactful work on the ground, each brings a systems-level perspective: thinking beyond their sectors to connect dots across movements and shape broader strategies for change. They advise Partners Asia on strategy and how to ensure that our support aligns with local practices, priorities, and long-term aspirations.



You supported more than \$3.7 million in flexible funds for 101 organizations and individuals in 2024.



These funds allowed Partners Asia to:

Promote community-based solutions to systemic issues


Distribute emergency response funding within days of a crisis

How did we distribute this funding?




Over 40% of our funding was used by partners to directly protect and promote basic human rights and respond to crises on the ground.





We transformed \$3.7 million in support into 171 grants and fiscal sponsorship funds across our partner network.





Nearly 75% of our grants and fiscal sponsorships went towards education, advocacy, alliance building, emergency response, and promoting human rights—including support for feminist leadership and the rights of the LGBTQ+ community.

"From Pain to Power" is a remarkable 20minute documentary produced by Partners Asia and the locally-led Ngao Tong Films in 2024 to illustrate the work of a key figure in Thailand's movement for LGBTQ+ rights.

Matcha Phorn In defies easy categorization: ethnic Lao, a lesbian, a feminist, and a human rights defender who is reimagining what is possible for women, children, and LGBTQ+ and indigenous people.

The documentary is part of our "In Their Own Voices" film series, which amplifies rights-based stories told by and for members of the communities we serve.

Innovative Funds:

Learning and Exchange Grants

Our **Learning and Exchange Grants** are an initiative unique to Partners
Asia and they invest in the strength and sustainability of local
organizations. These funds of around \$1,000 are designated for activities
that traditional donors often overlook: organizational development, skillsbuilding workshops with local experts, and networking opportunities with
likeminded groups.

Emergency Funding: Flood Relief Trust, responsiveness, and networks rooted in community

In September 2024, the worst flood in decades hit northern Thailand. A youth-led organization requested \$5,000 from Partners Asia to help some 60 children of migrant workers from Burma/Myanmar who had lost their school supplies in the disaster and could not afford to replace them.

They worked with parents and allocated the funds to buy uniforms, shoes, backpacks, and stationery so that the children could return to school. The need was identified, funded, and met within days.
